Over the course of the year, our vision of modern, diverse Jewish life came into clear focus. Even as antisemitism surged outside our walls, we nurtured a safe, joyful Jewish space inside.

Hundreds of community members, including **Mayor Daniel Lurie**(a proud JCCSF preschool alumnus) joined us for our **Gratitude Shabbat**and **Shabbat Around the Table**, two events filled with live music, Shabbat rituals, connection, and great food!



EVERYDAY JUDAISM

We also served up opportunities to take the wonder of Shabbat home. **Twist of Tradition: Hands-On**

Challah brought braiders of all ages to our atrium every month.

We hosted weekly Torah study and three 12-week sessions of Hebrew classes for 100+ leaders of all levels.

HOLIDAYS ARE CELEBRATED

Partnering with Reboot, we ushered in the year 5785 with a modern version of the 600-year-old Rosh Hashanah ritual known as **tashlich**. Hundreds heard the call of the shofar (accompanied by expert bagpipers) and started the year anew.



Our first **Hanukkah Maker's Market** warmed up the winter season for **300 people with 21 local vendors**.



Purimpalooza kicked off a spirited spring at the JCCSF! Collaborating with Congregation Emanu-El for the second year in a row, close to **900 participants** delighted in crafts, games, a *Wicked*-inspired Purim shpiel, and plenty of hamantaschen.

It's a reminder that so much of the Jewish practice has to do with gathering. Showing up. It's easier to do in times of joy and often more important in times of distress. It felt so nice to be in a shared space together and make joyful noise!

Passover at the JCCSF was joyful, meaningful, and delicious! Over 200 community members participated in our **First Night Passover Seder**, revisiting the story of liberation with song, ritual, and reimaginings of familiar Passover narratives.

Our second vibrant **Mimouna Celebration** with JIMENA (Jews Indigenous to the Middle East and North Africa) marked the end of Passover with the music, sweets, and traditions that make a Moroccan Mimouna uniquely festive.

From apples and honey to matzah and music, our **older adult cohort celebrated the Jewish holidays** with lively lunches, spirited rituals, and engaging talks, as preschoolers bridged the generations with handmade (and hand-delivered) holiday cards.

THE B'VAKASHA INITIATIVE: WE SHARE SPACE, IGNITE VITALITY & GROW COMMUNITY

We brought new meaning to the Hebrew word b'vakasha – "of course," "you are welcome." Launched last year, our trailblazing B'vakasha Initiative is making it possible for the JCCSF to serve a larger swath of the Bay Area's Jewish community, advance the work of many incredible Jewish nonprofits, and strengthen San Francisco's Jewish communal landscape.

The initiative prioritizes relationship-building over earned revenue. In the past year, we offered over \$70,000 in free and subsidized access to our venue spaces and co-hosted over 40 events with partner organizations to expand our collective impact.

STANDING STRONG - TOGETHER

Convening to explore, connect, and strengthen Jewish identity is core to our mission - and more urgent than ever. The complexity of Israel and the escalation of antisemitism have brought our community together in ways we never imagined.

We invited scholars, artists, and clergy to lead talks, workshops, and exhibitions. The JCCSF's Rabbi Batshir Torchio facilitated spiritual care programs. We held space for learning, dialogue, and growth, moving the work forward together.

Lee Yaron, acclaimed *Ha'aretz* investigative journalist and winner of last year's National Jewish Book of the Year Award, shared *10/7 Human Stories*. Yaron has chronicled the history of Israel and the Israeli-Palestinian conflict through the stories of 100 civilians murdered on October 7.

We welcomed **award-winning filmmaker Wendy Sachs** and her powerful documentary *October H8TE* (executive produced by Debra Messing), which examines the rise in campus antisemitism and anti-Israel sentiment after October 7 and its impact on free speech and democracy.



Holding onto Humanity
brought us messages of
hope. Partnering with
Congregation Sha'ar Zahav,
we brought Israeli-American
tech entrepreneur Offir
Gutelzon and Palestinian
peace activist Hamze
Awawde together for a
thoughtful and timely talk Hope in a Time of Trauma that contemplated the
Israeli-Palestinian conflict,
the pursuit of peace, and
a shared future.



The Broken Seder, the first large-scale immersive art installation in the Bay Area to explore how it feels to be Jewish in a post-October 7 world, made its debut at the JCCSF. Artist Day Schildkret's experiential piece adapted the age-old Passover question: "What makes this time different from all other times?" Over 400 visitors contemplated the answer.



In April, we presented San Francisco's

Yom HaShoah commemoration in
partnership with the JFCS Holocaust
Center and, together with community
partners, including the Consulate General
of Israel, organized the city's principal
Yom HaZikaron service in Hebrew.
Hundreds gathered to honor the lives lost
on October 7, victims of the Holocaust, and
Israel's fallen soldiers.

We welcomed literary luminary

Isabel Allende back to the JCCSF.

She discussed her gripping new historical novel, My Name is Emilia del Valle, in front of a sold-out audience with many first-time visitors.

Our *One Nation* art exhibition, curated by the Heller Museum at Hebrew Union College, captured the essence of our country's past, present, and future through paintings, woodcuts, photography, collage, and textiles in our Katz Snyder Gallery.

Prominent parent educator **Dr. Becky Kennedy** visited the JCCSF, offering concrete guidance grounded in clinical psychology. Prior to her visit, Rabbi Batshir Torchio led three discussion sessions with parents to explore the relationship between Dr. Becky's insights and Jewish parenting wisdom.















PRESCHOOL The 316 children enrolled in the JCCSF's three preschools developed socially, emotionally, and intellectually. They tested new waters, found BFFs, and harnessed the power of play. 20% of our students received financial assistance, totaling close to \$630,000.

We continue to invest in our JCCSF preschool educators. Our partnership with EarlyJ enabled 3 of our teachers to earn a master's degree in Jewish Early Childhood Education at American Jewish University – with EarlyJ generously covering 90% of tuition fees.

Our Parent Council is at the heart of our preschool community. These volunteers weave connections among families, support our teachers, and help make the JCCSF's preschool experience magical.

TIKVAH SCHOOL OF MUSIC


& DANCE Fifty-two Ukrainian and Russian children reconnected with their roots while experiencing Jewish culture through music, dance, art, and Shabbat ruach (spirit). Now in its 35th year, the program is enrolling children of alumni.

SWIM SCHOOL Thousands of children splashed, kicked, and got water safe. The JCCSF taught 1,400 swim lessons every week.

YOUTH SPORTS Hundreds of young athletes enrolled in basketball, volleyball, and soccer, getting a healthy mix of fundamentals and fun.

Our teen athletes joined over 2,800 peers from across the globe to play in the JCC Maccabi Games[®]. The games foster Jewish connections, personal growth, and lifelong resilience.

SUMMER CAMP 916 children thrived as campers. They stretched comfort zones, forged fast friendships, and soaked up Jewish joy. We distributed **\$97,000 in financial assistance** among 57 children in need.



FITNESS The JCCSF Fitness Center was named **Best Gym in San Francisco magazine's 2025 "Best of the Bay"** issue! From cardio to aquatics and spirited fitness events, welcoming members from 4,200 households, we're building strong bodies – and community.

HEALTHY AGING We engaged almost 3,000 lifelong learners all year long - in concerts, conversations, and a new virtual program called Aging Alone Together. Our taxi voucher program continued to help older adults get around town to run errands or work out at the Fitness Center. Thanks to the support of the Jewish Federation Bay Area, we distributed 365 free rides.

Hundreds of San Franciscans popped into the JCCSF's 8th annual **Sukkot Pop-Up** at the Ferry Plaza Farmers Market. They came to learn, engage, and taste the sweet and savory flavors of the Jewish fall harvest.



With winter's approach, our
7th **Glowing Hanukkah Pop-Up**brought more than 800 people to
Ghirardelli Square. Collaborating
with local artists, musicians, chefs,
and Jewish partners, we celebrated
Hanukkah light and turned the
iconic San Francisco landmark into
a shining communal Jewish space.



The JCCSF's innovative celebration of Black freedom, **Erev Juneteenth**, returned as an evening of heritage and heart, blending Black and Jewish traditions. Chef Michael W. Twitty and Joshua Nelson, the "Prince of Kosher Gospel," nourished the souls of a sold-out audience twice as large as the crowd at last year's debut.

Continuing a long-standing partnership, we teamed up with Value Culture on two **Jewish Heritage Nights** at iconic San Francisco venues. We rooted for our San Francisco Giants with Jewish pride at Oracle Park, and celebrated the wonders of the natural world at the California Academy of Sciences.

PROUD & JEWISH

Pride Month was full of JCCSF pride! With JCRC, we assembled the largest-ever Proud & Jewish contingent in San Francisco's Pride Parade, in partnership with the Jewish Community Federation and Keshet. We also presented the **14th Annual Pink Saturday Pride Zumbafest** and our colorful **Pride Family Festival**, which brought together drag performances, story time, dancing, and our many amazing community partners.

The swell of Pride at the JCCSF reflects our community's deep support of the LGBTQ+ community and respect for the generations of advocates dedicated to protecting their rights and safety.

SUPPORTING KIDS WHO NEED IT MOST

Over the past year, our civic partnerships helped bridge the opportunity gap for hundreds of San Francisco children.

Thanks to grant support from the **Department of Children, Youth** and Their Families (DCYF), JCCSF **Citywide** continues to thrive. Last year, the program provided free weekly arts instruction to 769 children attending 14 historically underserved K-5 public schools.

Our partnership with **Children's Council**, one of San Francisco's leading children's advocacy organizations, made JCCSF programs financially accessible to 23 children – 17 campers and 6 preschoolers!

This experience proved the benefits of having long-term relationships with school sites; even though we can't serve every public-school student with our program, we can have a lasting impact on many students' lives by showing up as a consistent programmatic partner.

KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY SAFE



A SOLID FINANCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Our rebound from the pandemic continues – we have a balanced budget and the JCCSF remains debt free. Earned revenue rose during FY25 and **philanthropic revenue has increased by 33%** over the past 4 years. The JCCSF's annual fundraising campaign, At the Heart of it All, reached its goal with a **7.7% year-over-year increase**.

A STUNNING NEW EXPERIENCE


The road ahead is filled with possibility, beginning with the **major renovation of Kanbar Hall**, our iconic theater and the cultural heart of our building.
